SMCC Food Pantry Report

February 2022

The SMCC Food Pantry is celebrating its 5th anniversary! We opened our doors in March of 2017 and continue to be 100% volunteer-run and funded from community donations and grants. Thank you to all of our dedicated volunteers and our 2021 donors - Payne's Chapel, Chestnut Grove, Big Sandy Methodist, Full Sun Farm, Grateful Roots Deli, Food Lion, Merry Mountain Rug Hookers, John Johnson, Dave Snelson, and our anonymous donors.

In 2021, we served a total of 1785 households and 5210 individuals with shelf-stable foods including meat, produce, eggs, milk, bread, and much more. We averaged 90 households at each distribution and handed out 95,000 + lbs of food to our community.

In January and February, we served 91 households at each distribution.

The new MANNA FoodBank CEO, Claire Neal, and other employees of MANNA joined us to help at our Feb 11th distribution. Everyone who comes out to Sandy Mush for the first time is amazed by the beauty of this place we call home and the historic SMCC schoolhouse. With the continued increase in need around Western North Carolina during this pandemic, MANNA has been working tirelessly to make sure that their 200 + partner pantries and other human service organizations get the food needed to thousands of families' tables.
