Food Pantry Report November, 2022

In November, the Food Pantry served 96 families and 299 individuals in our community.

The SMCC Food Pantry received a cash grant from Food Lion Foundation for \$2,500 to purchase food in the coming year.

The Golden Leaf Foundation is offering grants in 2023 to help expand the capacity and operation of North Carolina Food Pantries. SMCC is exploring writing one of these grants and submitted a pre-application to determine if we are eligible to submit a grant. We are exploring the feasibility of using funds to complete the storage in the Coal Room with electrical outlets and lights, improving the storage of perishables such as fruits and vegetables and improving the movement of food.

Food Pantry was able to offer either turkey or a small ham to each family for the Thanksgiving holiday as well as a full box of staples and fruits and vegetables. We are thankful to be able to continue offering eggs, bread and milk with most pantries.

Ilsa Myers and Jean and Bruce Larson attended food pantry meetings this Fall for our area and the country. The SMCC Food Pantry team is working on seeking additional sources of food resource in the area and sharing these resources with the food pantry clients.

Many thanks to everyone who helps make this valuable service available through SMCC: the Food Pantry Team, area churches and individuals who make donations, Food Lion on New Clyde Hwy. in Canton, Food Lion Foundation, MANNA and many more current, past and future.
