Food Pantry Report

February 2024

The Food Pantry distributes food on the second Friday of the month. In 2024 it has distributed food twice: January 12th and February 9th. With the February Food Pantry, seven years of service to the Sandy Mush community was completed.

- The January Food Pantry served 60 households comprising 168 individuals.
- The February Food Pantry served 83 households comprising 248 individuals.

Most of the food distributed at the Food Pantry is purchased from MANNA (canned goods, meats, vegetables, for the most part) or donated by Full Sun Farm (produce). We are grateful to MANNA and Full Sun Farm for their generosity and support.

Purchased foods are paid for with the financial contributions of Payne's Chapel, Chestnut Grove Baptist Church, individual donors who contribute specifically to the Food Pantry, and from grants, for example, from Food Lion Feeds. Bruce Larson recently spoke with two representatives of First Bank in relation to a potential contribution from their Power of Good grants program, and they anticipate letting us know about the grant in the latter part of March. As a reminder, Golden Leaf awarded SMCC \$26,324 in August 2023 for renovation of the Coal Room/Boiler Room area for Food Pantry use.

The next food distribution will be March 8th. Later that day, the Food Pantry Team will meet to discuss the operations of the Food Pantry and likely developments during the year.
