Food Pantry Report:

At the May Food Pantry we served 52 families and 160 individuals. We put in 131 hours of volunteer time.

We have been purchasing eggs and milk each month. MANNA just informed us that they have chosen our agency because they see the need and will now be supplying and delivering us milk each month at no cost to us. We are still purchasing eggs but have been lucky enough to get some farm fresh eggs donated by our local residents and farmers.

We received a large donation of rations from the Holstein family that was handed out at this months pantry. The food we received from the Stamp Out Hunger Post Office food drive was also distributed. We couldn't do this each month without the monetary and food donations and the support and volunteers from our community. Thank you to all who support the SMCC Food Pantry! We received a very nice letter from MANNA in support of our Pantry. The full letter will be available to read at the meeting. Here are some of the highlights: The Sandy Mush Community Center has been a fantastic partner and their service to their community aligns with our mission, which is to involve, educate, and unite people in the work to end hunger in Western NC. MANNA recognizes SMCC as an essential partner that continues to empower their community to work on various health issues including food insecurity. We appreciate their leadership in this important area and encourage your full support of SMCC Food Pantry.

Since their Opening in March of 2017, they have sourced over 65,000 pounds of food from MANNA at little to no cost. During 2018, they served 1525 individuals. In the past year, they have increased the amount of food brought to their pantry that Feeding America classifies as "Foods to Encourage". This includes fruits and vegetables (nothing added), grains (100% whole grains, rolled oats, barley, wild rice, etc.) proteins (eggs, lean meats, and non meat proteins), healthy cereals and beverages. They also work with local farmers to bring in more produce and eggs for each of their distributions.

SMCC is one of our finest partners and I highly recommend them for any opportunity that allows them to expand their reach in Sandy Mush. Leah Cormier, Buncombe County Outreach Coordinator
